The Makassar Tourism Polytechnic was established in 1991 under the Ministry of Tourism. Its vision is to become a leading tourism university based on Indonesian personality and competitive internationally in 2024.

Industrial Sector Background

- Makassar serves as a key hub connecting tourist to destinations in Eastern Indonesia and is popular for MICE (Meeting, Incentive, Convention, and Exhibition) tourism. In 2025, over 6 million tourist visited Makassar, with 98% dominated by domestic tourists.
- There are employment opportunities in various tourism industries, ranging from event management, hospitality, food production, content creation, and tour agencies.

Curriculum

The Polytechnic Tourism under Ministry of Tourism applied curriculum referring to ASEAN standard, Mutual Recognition Arrangement on Tourism Professional Competency ASEAN-Common Competency Assessment Tool (MRATP CACT), is a framework designed to bolster the mobility of tourism workers within the ASEAN region by standardizing qualifications and curricula.

With 70% of the curriculum focused on practical training and 30% on theory, students receive an in-depth and real world learning experience that prepares them to compete in the global tourism industry.
