

About SDC

The **Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC)** is the agency for international cooperation of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA). Its activities are anchored in the Federal Council's dispatch on Switzerland's International Cooperation 2017-2020, and guided by Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development. The Swiss Cooperation Office and Consular Agency in Phnom Penh is a branch representation of the Embassy of Switzerland in Bangkok.

Swiss Development Cooperation in Cambodia is people-centered and aligns its three priority domains (technical and vocational skills, agriculture and food security, local governance and citizen participation) with Cambodia's Rectangular Strategy. It pursues a rights-based approach which underlines the importance of human rights and basic freedoms. In this spirit, SDC supports multi-stakeholder partnerships (public, private, and non-for-profit) which represent all citizens of Cambodia, with a focus on the disadvantaged. We believe that inclusive participation in shaping the country's future development is key to achieving the country's priorities: SDGs as well as becoming a middle-income country by 2030.

Civil society plays an important role with its political engagement, its contribution to raise awareness about issues of concern for society, its commitment to enable citizens to exert influence and be active in shaping the world. Civil society is also a key player in the social sectors by providing valuable complimentary social services. SDC is strongly committed to keeping the work space for civil society as open and free as possible, which is an important endeavor at programmatic, political and policy levels.

The Private sector is a driver of economic development and progress, and a vital actor when it comes to improving people's livelihoods and their access to goods and services in the Cambodian market. The private sector needs to negotiate better conditions for doing business with the Government, similar to how civil society negotiates improved space for their work. SDC's engagement with the private sector is not only imbedded in its dispatch for international cooperation, it is a reality in many sectors of activities: Farmers need access to markets in order to earn a living; skilled youth need decent and gainful jobs with the private sector; local economic development cannot take place without the private sector.

We all work with very similar overarching goals; with somewhat different means to the end. SDG 17 invites us to work together in partnership. Mobilizing additional resources, combining our expertise and sharing our approaches will certainly yield higher results than if we work alone. SDC, the private sector, and NGOs can create synergetic relations and collaborations, and we can do that under the umbrella of **Swiss-ness**. Switzerland is known for high-quality products and services, for being reliable and responsible, for caring for the people with whom and for whom we work, for being committed to achieving the goals of Agenda 2030 (in Switzerland and worldwide) and for being open and frank about the key values that guide our work.

In order to **make our efforts in reaching common goals more effective**, we need to be more creative and innovative, we need to build partnerships and work in collaboration with the public, the private and non-for-profit sectors. I can appreciate that NGOs and businesses operate in different ways, however, this should not stand in the way of forming partnerships that may become significant in attaining prosperity and social justice for all Cambodian people. In doing so we can take better care of individuals and the environment.

The Swiss Business and NGO Forum is an opportunity to identify potential for **partnerships**, and to define **success factors** that may enhance our collaboration in pursuing development efforts in Cambodia.

Kantha Bopha Hospitals: from 1992 to 2007, Dr. med. Beat Richner opened five children's hospitals in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap, Angkor. The Kantha Bopha hospitals take care of about 85% of all the sick children in Cambodia. 80% of the seriously ill and hospitalized children would not have a chance of survival without these hospitals. All the treatments are free of charge. 80% of the Cambodians are without any means and 80% of patients come from families with a daily income of USD 1.00 or less.



Lighthouse Battambang offers underprivileged, disadvantaged, aspiring Cambodians a brighter future through individual support, personal assistance and sustainable projects. We believe in the importance of "Hand up, not Hand out," which people to do it themselves. Treating the root of the problems rather than just the symptoms is very important to us. Therefore, we try our best not to lead people into a dependency, but rather stay alongside them while they go through struggles and coach them to be self-sufficient. By teaching them life and other skills we are cheering them on to keep going.



Smiling Gecko Cambodia: Since the middle of the last century, Cambodia has been ravaged by decades of civil war and suffered terribly during the Vietnam war and the terror regime of the Khmer Rouge. In its capital Phnom Penh alone, tens of thousands of children live on the streets, suffering hunger, illness and abuse. Smiling Gecko is dedicated to helping these people – be it in the form of direct aid or through supporting other NGOs. Smiling Gecko focuses on areas of greatest need and helps people to help themselves through sustainable cluster projects.



Solidar Suisse: There are only very few truly independent and democratically organized trade unions in Cambodia. The state is actively blocking their efforts. Solidar Suisse supports strong, independent unions with significant female participation. This is the only way to improve women 's position in the garment industry.
