Founded in 1978 and operating under the Ministry of Tourism, Bali Tourism Polytechnic's vision is to become a higher education institution in the field of tourism that meets international standards of excellence with an Indonesian character.

Industrial Sector Background

- Bali, Indonesia's main tourism magnet, is expected to grow by 75,44% in 2026 (Expert Survey, 2025). In 2025, Bali received 6,95 million international tourists, an 11% increase from 2024. Meanwhile, the number of domestic tourists decreased by around 8%.
- The shift in focus from mass tourism to quality tourism requires qualified and certified workers and creates new opportunities, particularly in the areas of sustainability and environmental friendliness.

Curriculum

The Polytechnic Tourism under the Ministry of Tourism applied curriculum that refers to the ASEAN standard, Mutual Recognition Arrangement on Tourism Professional Competency ASEAN-Common Competency Assessment Tool (MRATP CACT). The framework is designed to bolster the mobility of tourism workers within the ASEAN region by standardizing qualifications and curricula. The curriculum composition varies by study program, with approximately 60% to 70% focused on practical training and 30% to 40% on theory. In the final semester, students are required to complete a final project and attend some classes.
